We celebrated International Woman's Month with an afternoon tea and several members asked for the recipe that original member Evelyn Wilty used to prepare. Though she is no longer with us, her tea lives on. Enjoy!

This recipe was prepared when we had a stove a pots!

- * Place two big pots filled with water on the stove and bring to a boil. Once the water is boiling turn to low.
- * Using regular tea, follow directions regarding how many tea bags to add.
- * Let the tea steep approximately five minutes (until it looks dark enough). Remove the tea bags.
- * To each pot, add 10 bags each of Celestial Tea, Apple Spice and Cinnamon Tea. Let steep and then remove the tea bags.
