Message from the President "All Pulling Together"

It is with a very grateful heart that I write this month, having just held our April 'President's Choice' meeting. To everyone who helped me with every aspect of this very important meeting, I can't thank you enough! I was hoping to accomplish several objectives and I admit I had a couple of ulterior motives for hosting officers from the St. Petersburg Police Department. After what seems like a very long time and many bumps in the road, our eagle statue 'Harriet' was finally ready for her unveiling! For our newer members who might not know her story, this eagle • was "adopted" by our club at the state convention 'way back in • April of 2019 as a pledge to raise at least \$500 to help with the restoration of educational signage along a popular trail in the Everglades National Park. Our donation would be matched dollar for dollar by the Southwest Florida Park Trust. Thanks to • the generosity of our members at the time, we raised over \$600 for a final figure of over \$1200! Recognizing that the bald eagle is a symbol used by our police department, we thought it would make a fitting gift to present to them (besides not having space to keep it in our clubhouse).

My second goal was to raise awareness of a specific need within the SPPD – a shortage of bullet proof, stab resistant vests for their K-9 dogs. After meeting Officer Webber and his partner, Stark, our ladies were inspired to begin a donation collection for our club to sponsor the purchase of a vest for one of their new dogs who doesn't yet have a vest. At this last meeting we were able to collect nearly \$300, and we're just getting started! More information is forthcoming.

Now a word about volunteering. Our ladies are unparalleled in their efforts to benefit the community with the projects and organizations we support, but you know, volunteerism begins at home. The ladies who help with our meetings are a prime example of that, but we need more of our members to step up. None of us can go it alone, and as the saying goes "many hands make light work."

My final word is a big congratulations to all of us for the club awards garnered at the State Convention April 13th which included a certificate for our Honor Score, a 2nd Place award in the Human Trafficking and Awareness category and a 3rd Place award for our newsletter! Keep up the good work, ladies!!!

May is Mental Health Awareness Month

Forming good habits for good mental health are important.

- 1. <u>Be active</u>. Movement is good for mind and body. A half hour of walking each day can boost your mood.
- 2. <u>Eat right</u>. Getting the right balance of foods can improve mental energy and focus. People who eat mostly fruits, vegetables, nuts, whole grains, fish, and unsalted fats (such as olive oil) are 30% less likely to be depressed than those who have a meat and dairy diet.
- 3. <u>Get enough shut eye</u>. Sleep is essential for overall health. It's the time when your body and mind recharge and repair.
- 4. <u>Limit screen time</u>. Blue light from screens such as phones, TVs, laptops and tablets can make it harder to fall asleep.
- 5. <u>Make time for mindfulness</u>. Meditation, muscle relaxation, and breathing all work very well. Activities like yoga and tai chi are good examples.
- 6. <u>Focus on relationships</u>. When you feel connected to your family, friends, and loved ones, hard times can be easier to bear. All the good times feel better when you have people to share them with. In fact having close relationships plays a big part in overall health.
- 7. Last but not least. <u>Be mindful</u> of the thoughts you feed yourself. Ask the negative thoughts to be gone. Let positivity course through your mind and body.
