2025 Annual Report

Our theme this year has been “All Pulling Together” as we continue to place emphasis on how much we can accomplish as long as we work together. We started the year out with 187 members, and we currently have 224!

Our finances this year have taken some hits, the first being the necessity of replacing our air conditioning system. We also realized that our caretaker’s apartment was in desperate need of updating for the safety and comfort of his family. And then came Hurricane Helene who flooded our clubhouse with 2’ of seawater and sewage, but I’ll come back to that. Currently, we are \$40K in the red, but we are solvent. We lost \$27K in bookings, due to the hurricane and getting the new A/C working properly, but suffice it to say our Finance Officer has our affairs well in hand, we are still in good shape.

Although not covered individually in this report, I want to point out our Social Activities, Book Club and House & Grounds committees are always active. Also too numerous to recount are the activities of our Civic Engagement CSP who are consistently producing quilts, twiddle muffs, walker bags, stuffed animals, bone pillows, crocheted bags for hygiene products and the like for Ronald McDonald House, Hospice, and Sallie House to name a few. They are always busy!

January saw a very successful Arts & Crafts competition where our very talented members dazzled us with their skills in various categories. We had a total of 9 blue ribbon entries to send to the District competition in February. Our featured speakers were from the Suntan Art Center on St. Pete Beach and spoke of the educational opportunities in various mediums. Our Health & Wellness CSP hosted a Qi Kong seminar and offered classes in that discipline.

In February, we hosted the District 14 Arts & Crafts Festival and luncheon where the theme was Mardi Gras. We had 6 blue ribbon winners that went to the state competition. Our February program, hosted by our Health & Wellness CSP featured the Supervisor of the Memory Disorders Center of St. Anthony’s who spoke to us about the services & resources available at no charge to patients with memory disorders and their families. Our Tuesday group volunteered at the Dreammaker Luncheon for the Children’s Dream Fund. We also got our new air conditioner!

Our March meeting was a membership tea hosted by our Membership committee celebrating International Women’s Day. Our Tuesday group did their first lasagna dinner at Praise the Lord Mission for food insecure families. Arts & Culture CSP organized a tour of Sunken Gardens that was well attended. Easter came early this year, and 30 members of our club filled 800 plastic eggs with jelly beans and made 40 Easter baskets for the kids at Sallie House and the residents of Brookwood Academy. We also had volunteers from the Tuesday group helping out at the Firestone Grand Prix. The Book Club held a book drive to benefit All Children’s Hospital and Ronald McDonald House.

Our April meeting was a pot luck luncheon honoring the St. Pete Police Department. We had 5 officers plus one K-9 as our guests. They spoke about their duties and answered questions from our group. We presented them with a statue of a bald eagle as a thank you to the department for their service. President Sundholm proposed collecting donations towards sponsoring a bullet proof vest for one of the K-9’s as an ongoing project. Five of our members attended the Spring Annual Convention in Orlando and picked up club awards for our Honor Score, our newsletter and for Human Trafficking Awareness. Our VP of Daily Operations proposed repairs/renovations for the caretaker’s apartment, and it was approved. We had members turn out at the St. Pete airport to greet the Honor Flight veterans returning from Washington, DC.

For our May meeting hosted by our Environment CSP, we welcomed representatives from Sea Turtle Trackers who spoke to us about their efforts to monitor and protect sea turtle nests on our beaches and barrier islands. We also collected over 300 boxes of cereal to be donated to our Title One school for food insecure kids who might not have breakfast while school is out for the summer. In partnership with the Children's Dream fund (for children who are victims of life threatening illnesses), our Tuesday group and the Juniors club organized and staged a Mother's Day event for 25 Dream Children and their families to let the kids make cards, decorate and fill gift bags, and make paper flowers and bracelets to give to their moms for Mother's Day. The moms were treated to refreshments while the children had fun making their gifts.

In June we sent several representatives to the District Workshop in Bradenton. Our Tuesday group stayed active, assisting with the Belle of the Ball program helping teens with dresses for prom, and making another lasagna dinner for Praise the Lord Mission. In July, our Civic Engagement members delivered 32 crocheted bags filled with hygiene products to the Free Clinic and handmade stuffed animals for Hospice and Ronald McDonald House.

There was no business meeting in August, but there were volunteer activities happening. Our members volunteered at the Rays on the Runway event to benefit the Children's Dream Fund which raised more than \$200K. Work on the caretaker's apartment was completed.

September saw a successful collection of over \$2000 of school supplies for our adopted school and we enjoyed a program from a representative of Habitat for Humanity, hosted by the Education & Libraries CSP. We had 4 members attend the Fall Board of Directors meeting in Orlando, where we delivered a large amount of food and clothing items our club collected for the GFWC National Day of Service. Several of our members went to the St. Pete airport again to welcome home veterans on the 50th Honor Flight

October started out pleasant enough until Hurricane Helene dealt us a devastating blow. Our October meeting was cancelled because of the hurricanes. Our clubhouse was completely flooded by the storm, and as a result, we have been aggressively pursuing remediation and repairs. Our progress to date is nothing short of astounding, thanks to our energetic VP of Daily Operations and a team of dedicated helpers! Obviously funds will be needed to meet our rather large deductible, so a GoFundMe campaign was initiated, (currently at a little over \$6K) among other efforts. We are in the process of replacing all of the furnishings, and many numerous other things we lost, and we will have a brand new kitchen, too! In the meantime, our prayers continue for our members who also suffered devastating losses. Our Tuesday group still managed to coordinate another Mission dinner despite limited facilities and lack of electricity. We were also able to send 7 representatives to the Annual District meeting in Clearwater where we shared the extent of our damages and promoted our fundraiser in November.

Here we are now, in November and so pumped about the amazing success of our fundraiser, an evening of Jazz in St. Pete! No one believed we could do it so soon after the hurricane, but we did it, thanks to the vision and dedication of our VP of Fundraising and our VP of Daily Operations, and our amazing members who helped.

Today we elect a new slate of officers and look forward to what our team can accomplish in 2025. This past year has been bumpy at times, but it has been my pleasure and my honor to work with you all.

In spite of the challenges, the impact we have made on our community is immeasurable, as evidenced by the outpouring of generosity and concern by our neighbors and associates. This report, although lengthy, can't possibly cover all we have done as a team. We're still able to make a contribution to 9 local non-profits because they're suffering, too. We have the potential to exceed the volunteer hours of previous years, and once our repairs and improvements are done, this Grand Old Lady will be the Pride of St. Pete!
